

September Short Report: EMS Response to Nonfatal Overdose Incidents



### **Background**

Drug overdose is a leading cause of injury in the U.S., accounting for over 100,000 deaths each year¹ and 6-times that number in nonfatal emergency department visits.² Of the estimated 9 million individuals with opioid use disorder, only a quarter receive necessary treatment³ and naloxone dispensing rates vary widely across the country.⁴ Prompt intervention by EMS clinicians and bystanders during overdose events saves lives and can help put individuals on a path to recovery from substance use disorders.

Rate of Nonfatal Overdoses per 1,000 EMS Primary Response, Overall and Opioid






nonfatal overdoses per 1,000 EMS primary responses



**72%** were opioid related






higher rate of nonfatal overdoses in men aged 30-39 years old than the overall population


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## **Key Findings**

#### **Response characteristics:**


## Location of Response





- **4%** of responses noted patient or bystander-reported drug use
- of responses documented drug paraphernalia on scene
- **87%** of nonfatal overdose responses resulted in patient transport
  - 6% refused transport against medical advice
  - of patients received resuscitation efforts (defibrillation, ventilation, or chest compressions)
